## California Car Seat Law

## Rear-Facing

According to California car seat law, a child will travel in a rear-facing car seat if they are:

- Under 2 years of age
- Weighs 40 or less pounds
- Or 40 or less inches tall


## Forward-Facing

By law, when a child outgrows the safety weight and height limit for rear-facing car seats, you can use a forward-facing car seat. Generally, it happens when the child is 4 years old, weighs 40 pounds and is $40^{\prime \prime}$ tall.

## Child Booster Seat

A child is ready for a booster seat when they have outgrown the weight or height limit of their forward-facing harness, which is typically between 40 and 65 pounds. Read the forward-facing car seat's owners' manual to determine height.

## When Can my Child Sit in the Front Seat?

Under the law, children who are older than 8 years and taller than $4^{\prime} 9^{\prime \prime}$ can sit in the front seat but it is recommended by experts that you use booster seats until the age of 13 .

## Also Illegal in California

Leaving a child under the age of 6 in a car. They must be with someone at least 12 years of age.

Smoking in a car with a minor in it.
